Warrior Hike: A journey home for soldiers 'walking off the war'

In 2012, two Marines who had recently returned from overseas duty passed through Franklin on the inaugural Warrior Hike.

Marine Corps captains Mark Silvers and Sean Gobin founded Warrior Hike in 2011 and hiked all 2,185 miles of the Appalachian Trail while raising \$50,000 to purchase adapted vehicles for seriously wounded veterans.

This past weekend, eight veterans continued that legacy. As with prior year's hikers, the eight combat veterans faced snow during the first stage of the trip, which began at the Appalachian Trail terminus in Springer Mountain, Ga.

Hailing from different

states, different branches of service and ranging in age and background, the eight hikers taking part in the 2014 Warrior Hike stopped in Franklin Friday, March 28, to enjoy some of the Trail Days celebration. The hikers were sponsored by VFW Post 7339 and The American Legion post 108.

The chance to "decompress" on the hike - to have time to think and process, and to be around others who have been through the same thing, is an important opportunity, said hiker Joe Young.
